

SJCSD VIPS JOIN CROOKSHANK SCHOOL COMMUNITY FOR VETERANS DAY REMEMBRANCE AND

BUILDING DEDICATION CEREMONY

Dr. Joyner, Mr. Forson, Martha Mickler, Patrick Canan and 25 veterans of foreign wars joined 880 preschool through fifth grade students on the front to honor the men and women who serve in our armed forces to protect our freedoms. At the beginning of the ceremony, members of the safety patrol respectfully raised a flag that flew over a Iraq and led all students and visitors in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. Crookshank's Chorus sang a stirring National Anthem and the patriotic song, "American Tears". All veterans in attendance were introduced to the children and several chose to speak about their experiences, including a World War II veteran who was present at the D-Day invasion. The 2016 Veterans Day observance was Crookshank's largest and most successful to date.

Following the Veterans Day remarks, Dr. Joyner and Mr. Canan spoke to students about the decision to build a new 22-room building at Crookshank. The building more than doubles the interior space at our school. Students were invited to participate in drawing and essay contests and the winners shared their pictures and essays with the crowd. With two buildings now on campus, a building naming contest was held and a vote was taken to name the historical I959 building the "Cub Den" and the new intermediate building, the "Cougar Den". Everyone enjoyed refreshments and tour after the ceremonies.

Following the Veterans Day and Building Dedication ceremonies, Mrs. Clough's mosaic was unveiled in the Ist Floor Commons, where the art will be a focal point of the area where students study and learn in different ways. Children and adults marveled at the beauty and intricacy of her work. During the second semester Manila will be volunteering as an Artist-in-Residence at Crookshank. All of us are very grateful for her talent, generosity and special interest in our students.






Crookshank Elementary is an AVID school What is AVID?

Culture: AVID Culture incorporates rigorous, relevant, differentiated opportunities for all students in an environment that promotes college readiness.


Leadership: AVID Leadership supports, guides, and facilitates AE implementation for all students.
