Sampling Juicy Reads in a "Book Tasting"



When it comes to reading, just like eating, the perfect way to pique someone's appetite for a good book is to offer a taste! R.B. Hunt held its first "Book Tasting" last January to give our youngest students a chance to sample different authors, genres, and series. This high-impact event engaged students in a fun activity while introducing them to a wide array of books. Groups of young readers,

kindergarten through second grade, were invited to the media center to degust different genres within the non-fiction category. The book tasting gave students the opportunity to sample some juicy reads in a short period of time and create a wish list of titles. No more choruses of "I don't have anything to read!"

The media center was designed to look like a restaurant, with classical music playing in the background, and vases of flowers on tables dressed in tablecloths. In the center of each table, there was a set of books from different non-fiction genres. Students took a seat and "sampled" the book in front of them. Students rated the books on worksheets designed to look like menus. After checking out the front and back covers and inside flaps, students browsed through the book to develop their first impressions. When time (3–5 minutes) was up, students wrote down observations, rated the book, and made note of whether they wanted to add the book to their wish list.

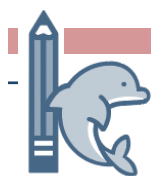

"Passport to Learning" Documents Journey of Education

For the second year in 2019-20, KES implemented an initiative called "Passport to Learning" to document and motivate student learning outside of a traditional classroom setting. All students were given a booklet with six "destinations" to visit throughout the year: At Home, Virtual Learning, Character Counts, Independent Reading, Homework, and Attendance. Specific criteria for each destination were determined with the purpose of developing academic stamina and building success skills. Moving the focus on learning to outside the classroom creates knowledge that is more relevant.

While traveling on this journey of education, students had the opportunity to perform acts of kindness and to see the impact this has on those around them. The display of good character helps to foster a community of caring and to create an environment where it is safe to learn and grow in self-esteem and confidence. Parents got involved in their child's education since some of the "destinations" were at home. Parents and students participated in "field trips" together to explore and teach their child about the world around them, providing not only an academic benefit but also a family bonding opportunity. Most rewarding to staff was observing the change in student motivation.

Initially, students were driven by external rewards such as recognition certificates and attendance at a Grow and Glow party. As they grew in stamina however, there was a shift towards intrinsic motivation. Guided by the "Passport to Learning," students recognized the benefits of engaging in behaviors that encourage healthy learning habits.

STEM Lessons from Farm to Table



Students at Osceola, with support from INK!, the University of Florida Agricultural Department, and the Chef's Collaborative at Urban Asado (a local Argentinian grill manufacturer), learned all facets of farm to table gardening last spring while incorporating STEM lessons. Using an edible garden as an outdoor learning laboratory, we instilled in students the desire to eat nutritious

food. Too often, family meals consist of ready-made or boxed, processed food which has little to no nutritional value. STEM Farm to Table is a program that exposes students to all facets of growing healthy foods from seeds, harvesting the foods, then preparing and presenting the foods for consumption.

The goal of the project was to teach students the science behind growing their own food, providing them with a healthy alternative for meals that they can prepare themselves. With the help of our business partners, students gained first-hand knowledge of STEM concepts by growing plants with hydroponic systems, organic soils, using environmentally safe, organic fertilizers, harvesting the plants, and then learning various ways in which the plants can be prepared and eaten. Business partners met with the students at least twice a month to provide guidance and in-school field trip experiences. The culminating activity for the students, with the help of our business partners, was to prepare a meal for families and donors to be held at the Urban Asado, 150 Iberia Street, showcasing the journey from Farm to Table.

Partnership with Flagler College is a Win-Win



Webster partnered last year with Flagler College around several projects that emphasized hands-on learning for students at both Webster and Flagler. On Mondays after school, Webster students rode a bus to Flagler College where they met up with students in the Education Department to receive one on one mentoring, share in writing a piece of historical fiction, and eat dinner in the dining hall with their college mentor. This tutoring

experience culminated in a special program at Flagler College where the families of our Webster students joined them for dinner. After dinner, students read their finished pieces of historical fiction to all in Flagler's Legacy Room. A similar program took place on Tuesdays with a different group of students focused on increasing their math skills. After school Webster students took busses to Flagler College, ate dinner with their tutor/mentor, and received one on one tutoring on math standards they found the most difficult. Webster students have been overheard saying things like "I wish every day was Monday," "This time goes too fast," and "I love going to college!"

While Flagler Education majors had the opportunity to practice teaching strategies with "real" students, Webster students received invaluable mentoring and tutoring as they were inspired to set going to college as a goal. A win-win for both The Webster School and Flagler College!

Showcasing Science + Arts

Learning across disciplines is evident at RJMMS, especially in our second semester when students and teachers have the opportunity to showcase their skills to the public. Highlights last spring included:

- **LEGO Robotics Club:** After preparing all year, students put their creativity to the test in a FIRST LEGO League competition.
- **National History Day:** RJMMS students earned top honors at the district-wide competition in the Research Paper category and in the fields of Documentary, Exhibit, and Performance.
- **International Science and Engineering Fair:** Students pick a topic to investigate and conduct authentic scientific research to support or disprove their hypothesis to compete in this annual event.

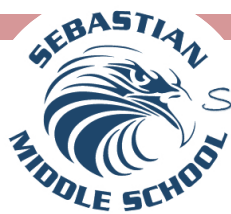

Explore a Career in Public Safety at SAHS!

St. Augustine High School is proud to offer the Academy of Law and Homeland Security. This program allows students to learn and study the court system, jail system, juvenile justice system, patrol officer responsibilities, and crime scene investigation. In the highest level of the program, students have the opportunity to complete the requirements for the Florida Class D Security Guard License and the Police Service Aide. If students choose, they may enroll in a 911 Telecommunicator course that will allow them to complete the requirements to test for the state dispatch license. These opportunities pave the way for some students to acquire jobs in this field immediately after high school graduation.

The Academy of Law and Homeland Security classroom on our campus is state of the art. In addition to the typical classroom desks, it includes a practice evidence locker, 911 Dispatch simulation stations, and an interactive training room. This training room is used to teach students how to interact with and react to real life situations. The instructors control the program in real time, offering students a learning experience that is ever changing and adapting.

While this is our newest academy at SAHS, we are committed to supporting its growth into one of our largest and most popular academy choices. We encourage students who are interested in the field of public safety to apply for this one-of-a-kind learning experience.

Schoology Help for Parents



Schoology is an online management tool that coordinates curriculum, assessments, grading and other classroom tasks and provides a communication platform for educators and students. Adopted for use in St. Johns County schools in 2016-17, Schoology was designed to be used by teachers, students and parents in grades 6-12. With the introduction of Distance Learning due to COVID-19 last spring, all elementary schools also now use Schoology to facilitate virtual instruction.

Whether your student is a Distance Learner or physically inside the classroom, all parents are encouraged to use Schoology to monitor your child's assignments. Schoology provides a window for parents to view how teachers design and implement their lesson plans, assignments and grades. Teachers use it to post updates to their class and communicate with students. Most importantly, when you ask your student what assignments s/he needs to complete for homework, and the reply is "Nothing!", you can now double-check that answer on Schoology.

District staff hosted a series of virtual parent training sessions for Schoology at the start of this school year. If you weren't able to attend those trainings, you can view the video of a training session in its entirety, along with a host of other resources, here: <https://www.stjohns.k12.fl.us/media/edtech/schoology/schoology-for-parents/>

A few tips of particular importance:

- On your computer, access Schoology using Chrome or Firefox as your web browser.
- When using a mobile device, use the web browser Chrome or Safari, not the Schoology app.
- Parents should create your own account in Schoology, using your own name and password, and linking it to your student's account with an access code provided by your child's homeroom teacher.
- All SJCS students have their own Schoology account and must submit their work through the student account (not the parent account).
- Grades should be viewed in Home Access Center (HAC), not Schoology. Schoology is primarily used to monitor classwork and homework.
- Teachers use Schoology primarily to communicate with students in their classes. Unless your child's teacher has specified otherwise, most teachers prefer that parents communicate with them by email. Teacher email addresses can be found in HAC.
- If you do not have a HAC account, or are having trouble logging in, please contact your school's Registrar or Computer Operator for assistance.



i-Ready®

In this day and age of standardized assessments, parents often feel as if their students are being over-tested and that teachers are being forced to "teach to the test." Although all students in our district must take the FSA in the spring of each year as required by the State of Florida, teachers have wide latitude in preparing students throughout the year. One of the progress-monitoring tools adopted for use in our district is i-Ready, a computer-based assessment tool available for use in both Reading and Math for students in grades K-8.

The i-Ready Diagnostic is an adaptive assessment that adjusts its questions to suit your student's needs. Each item seen by a student is individualized based on their answer to the previous question. Based on the data collected, the i-Ready Personalized Instruction module creates lessons for students based on their individual skill level and needs, so your student can learn at a pace that is just right for them. The lessons are fun and interactive to keep your students engaged as they learn. In this way, i-Ready allows your child's teacher(s) to meet your student exactly at their level and provides data to increase your student's learning gains on the FSA.

Students can also access i-Ready from home and use it as a supplemental tool to hone their skills in a particular area. Please contact your student's teacher(s) for more information.

ESE: Exceptional Student Education

ESE programs and services address the unique needs of students who are gifted in grades K-12, and those with mild, moderate and severe disabilities from age three until they graduate or reach age 21. COMPEL at Flagler College

Under the direction of Lourdes Khosrozadeh, Director of ESOL programs for SJCS, COMPEL stands for Collaborative Online Mentoring Program for English Learners. Through this vibrant program, Flagler College students who are training to become teachers are paired with students from elementary, middle and high schools who are seeking to acquire English Language skills in listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Vocabulary development is an area of concentration, and this collaboration provides an opportunity for English learners to benefit from individualized instruction. Flagler students meet from 30-60 minutes per week with their ELL mentees online using Zoom. Approximately 20 SJCS students are currently participating in this program, in languages such as Portuguese, Spanish, German, Hungarian, Vietnamese, and Chinese.
