REPORT CARDS

On Friday, February 12 report cards will be available on the HOME ACCESS CENTER (HAC) for grades K-5. A paper copy <u>will not</u> be sent home. The HAC portal provides parents and students with a daily summary page of student information including schedule and attendance, discipline information, class work, test scores, grades, and course requests.

Parents/Guardians must have a valid email address on file with a St. John's County School in order to create a HAC account.

You should receive an email with a link to complete your registration



What is a School Advisory Council (SAC)?

A SAC is a diverse group of stakeholders of a school, established through Florida Law, with shared goal of increasing student achievement in a safe learning environment. A SAC is comprised of the Principal, teachers, education support staff, parents, business partners and community members. The majority of the members must be non-school employees and members must be representative of the community.

What is the role of SAC?

The SAC assists in the preparation and evaluation of the School Improvement Plan (SIP) and acts as a resource to the school principal. The term advisory is intended to mean inquiring, informing, suggesting, recommending, and evaluating.

What is the School Improvement Plan?

"The whole point of school improvement is data-driven decision making. The process is SUPPOSED to be fairly simple and straight forward: The SAC reviews relevant data (which is much more than test scores), identifies problem areas, develops improvement strategies, monitors their implementation, and then starts the whole process over when the next round of data is available."

Safer, Smarter Kids


Students will participate in a **Safer, Smarter Kids** lesson with the school counselor during their PE class over the next few weeks. This program covers state-mandated safety lessons for students in Kindergarten through Grade 5 covering topics including:

- Safety awareness
- Respecting yourself and others
- Developing self esteem
- Peer pressure
- Bullying, cyberbullying
- Assessing safe vs. unsafe situations
- Understanding rules and responsibilities
- Identifying and protecting body boundaries
- Listening to a guiding voice
- Accessing help and identifying trusted adults
- Determining safe vs. unsafe touches
- Safe vs. unsafe secrets
- Staying safe online and on digital devices
- Establishing personal power and influence

Distance Learning Expectations – Quarter 2

Our teachers are teaching students in a classroom while also simultaneously delivering instruction to students at home. We are committed to keeping all children on pace and focused on the same high standards, the way in which learning occurs will vary from the classroom to the distance learning setting.

We ask that parents use the same methods of communication that you used prior to the pandemic. Teachers cannot respond to parent communication during the school day while teaching. Please communicate with our teachers in one of the following ways: Class Dojo, email, voicemail. Teachers will respond during non-instructional times.

We also ask that students follow the provided distance learning schedule; this will vary based on class and students' needs. Teachers will ask students to log on at certain times for whole group live sessions. During non-live sessions, students will be asked to complete independent work, assignments, and assessments. It is the expectation that students be on time to their sessions, a teacher cannot stop instruction to catch a student up. Teachers will offer specific times to remediate instruction for distance learners if needed. It is the expectation that students log on to their intervention groups. ALL ASSIGNMENTS AND ASSESSMENTS ARE DUE WITHIN TWO WEEKS OF THE ASSIGNED DATE. After two weeks, students will earn a zero if the assignment and/or assessment has not been submitted.

Attendance is being recorded daily; your student will be marked absent if they do not log on. In addition, students that log on for attendance only then log off will be marked absent beginning next week.

If your student is not able to regularly attend Schoology sessions, engage with their teacher, and/or complete assignments, in the best interest of your child please reconsider this learning model. Currently, we are encouraging families to remain in the selected learning model until the end of the second quarter.

DISMISSAL

Students needing to go home prior to dismissal will be escorted to their guardian's vehicle. *ONLY guardians are able to check students out prior to the end of the school day*. NO EARLY DISMISSAL AFTER 2PM (after 12PM on Wednesdays). Please follow these steps:

- Park in one of three designated parking spots in the second row. Spots will be marked with a sign.
- Please call (904)547-7840 in order to reach the receptionist in the front office.
- Tell the reception area the first and last name of the student(s).
- Have a photo ID ready to show the staff member that will approach your vehicle.
- Your child will be delivered to your car after ID check. STAY IN YOUR VEHICLE THROUGHOUT THIS PROCESS.

Please give yourself enough time for this process. It may take a few minutes for your child to be dismissed.

If you are changing the way your child normally goes home, please contact the school in one of three ways: **via the Dismissal Change link on our school's homepage**, a note in the planner, or a written note from home.

Dismissal changes **will not** be accepted over the phone OR after 2:00PM/12:00PM on Weds. unless there is an emergency.
